**Details for Hour Exam, February 18, 2011**

Your exam will consist of a set of Identifications (terms and people) and essay questions.

You will be given 5 terms or names and asked to identify THREE of them as to the significance of the term or of the person in light of our course of study and where the term or person appeared in our readings and lectures. You should do this in three sentences or less for each one. This will constitute 15% of the exam.

You will also be given three essay questions from which you will choose to write on TWO. Your essays will be evaluated both with regard to content and organization. An excellent essay will be well written with lots of relevant details. Be sure to read the questions carefully so that you answer the question that is asked.

For the exam you need to review all the lectures and all the reading assignments in the course, including Dr. Breyer's lecture on Wednesday, and be able to articulately summarize their contents and compare and contrast the readings with each other. For instance, here's an example of the kind of essay question you might be asked:

What was Isaac's Newton argument in his General Scholium to his *Principia Mathematica* and how might his view best be classified in Ian Barbour's four-fold classifications of the relations between religion and science?

Each of the two questions will be worth 43% (rounded).
